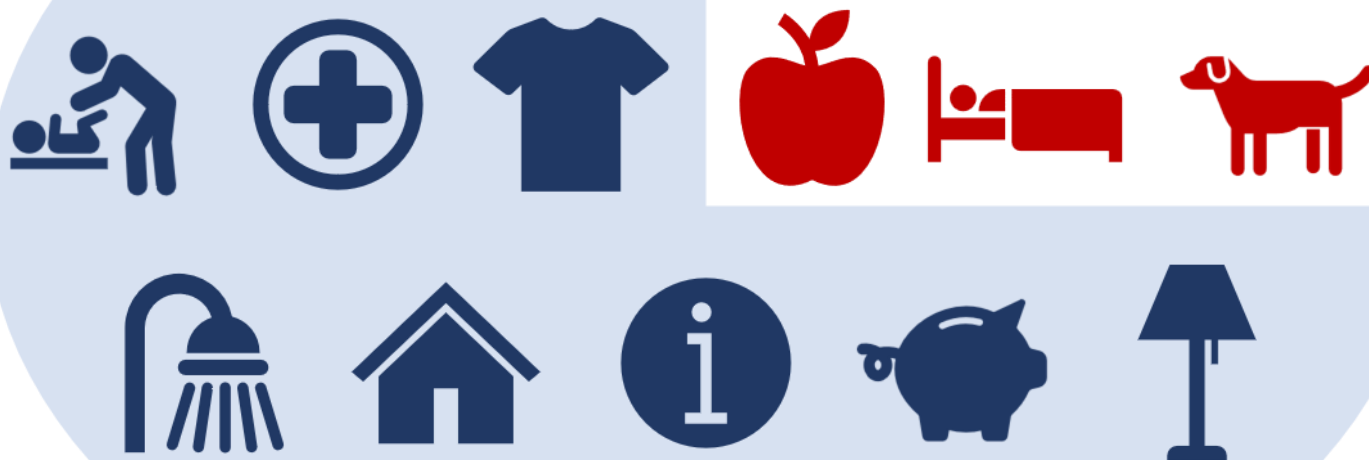

# HOUSING



## 1. COORDINATED ENTRY

**Coordinated Entry is your first stop and best resource** if you are homeless or about to become homeless. A resource navigator will talk with you to determine which temporary housing programs you are eligible for and which one will have the quickest availability. Resource connection is offered by prevention navigators and resource navigators to assist households to access various resources, such as employment or healthcare, to improve housing stability or resolve homelessness.

### Services:

**HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION** - Homelessness prevention navigators work with coordinated entry participants to identify a strategy for staying housed. They help households address and resolve their immediate barriers to housing stability, which can include negotiating with landlords, identifying alternative housing options and connecting participants with services to address issues such as lack of income, employment, or health insurance.

**HOMELESS SERVICES** - Resource navigators work with individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness to locate and maintain housing. Since housing resources are very limited, resource navigators focus on stabilizing most households using short-term interventions and connections to other services. Resource navigators also connect those who need long-term housing and supports to the appropriate housing programs to meet their needs.

## 1. FOOD ASSISTANCE

### **Washington's Basic Food Program**

Provides food assistance to eligible people. This program may also be referred to as Food Stamps or EBT (Electronic Benefit Transfer).

## 2. EDUCATION (MCKINNEY-VENTO ACT)

If you have no permanent place to live, federal law (the McKinney-Vento Act) allows you to keep your child in the same school at no added cost to you. Under the McKinney-Vento Act, children in homeless situations have the right to:

- Go to school, no matter where they live or how long they have lived there.
- Attend either the local school or the school of origin, if this is in their best interest; the school of origin is the school the child attended when they were permanently housed or the school in which the child was last enrolled.
- Receive transportation to and from the school of origin.
- Enroll in school immediately, even if missing records and documents normally required for enrollment, such as a birth certificate, proof of residence, previous school records, or immunization/medical records.
- Enroll, attend classes, and participate fully in all school activities while the school gathers records.
- Have access to the same programs and services that are available to all other students, including transportation and supplemental educational services.
- Attend school with children not experiencing homelessness; a school cannot segregate a student because they were homeless.
