Lawyers from Snohomish County Legal Services (SCLS) will be available to answer your questions about landlord/tenant laws. Presentations will be held from 5:30pm - 6:45pm and are open to the public; **registration is required.**

SCLS will also host a legal clinic before the presentation from 4:00 - 5:30 pm. They will provide free legal assistance to qualifying low-income Snohomish County residents. The attorney will meet with you one-on-one for brief consultations on housing rights and similar legal issues, including (but not limited to) the above presentation topics. The clinic is a drop-in event, first come first served (no registration required). Once you arrive for the clinic, you will need to sign in and fill out paperwork.

The sign-in list will be available at the front desk by 3:30 PM.
